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## Report on the use of Pupil Premium 2014-15



## **Pupil Premium at Bradford Central PRU in 2014-15**

At Bradford Central PRU (BCPRU), we aim to provide outstanding care, guidance, support and teaching to all of our pupils and are totally committed to enable our most vulnerable pupils to achieve their potential. To support these pupils we receive Pupil Premium funding.

### **What is Pupil Premium funding?**

BCPRU was allocated £2,503 for the 2014-15 financial year. The amount of Pupil Premium funding is allocated based on the number of pupils who are or have been entitled to free school meals and the number of pupils who are in care. The number of pupils that are allocated Pupil Premium is calculated as part of the census. **For BCPRU, only pupils who are single registered (not dual registered with a school) are allocated Pupil Premium.** This means that BCPRU was allocated Pupil Premium for only two pupils in the 2014-15 financial year.

For the purpose of this report, the academic data being used is for any pupil that would have been entitled to receive Pupil Premium during the 2014-15 academic year, if they had been solely registered with BCPRU. This totalled 91 pupils out of the 169, which equates to 54% of pupils.

### **What have we used the funding for?**

During the last academic year, the Pupil Premium funding has helped to provide part funding of Reading Matters to support improved access to reading recovery.

### **How has this impacted on attainment for our Pupil Premium funded pupils?**

The table below highlights the academic data for Pupil Premium pupils for the 2014-15 academic year:

Although there are minor fluctuations between pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding, compared to the whole cohort, they are broadly in line with each other. This highlights that the progress of pupils, from this group, are making similar progress to the whole PRU cohort.

At BCPRU all pupil needs are met and the relatively small amount of funding that is provided, through the allocation of Pupil Premium, is used to support the meeting these needs. This has been effective and it is intended to continue to use this funding to continue with this support.

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
